Accommodation:

The College organises village style accommodation for all first year students. The cost is €1,650 per academic semester for a single room, 3 students per house, all with their own bathroom.

Meal Charge:

As part of their education, Year 1 students are provided with 2 meals a week during 20 weeks of practical training at a cost of €400 per annum. Each meal consists of three courses.

Health Insurance:

Health insurance is mandatory for visa purposes. If a student already has health insurance, proof must be provided. Otherwise health insurance must be paid with Year 1 fee. Health insurance is approx €120 per year.

Placement Charge:

There is a charge of €1,000 for the organisation and administration of the Year 2 Industry Placement. This charge is to be paid before April 30th, 2010. The College finds industry partners, arranges placements, supervises placements and visits students during this year.

Earnings:

A student is paid approx €18,000 per annum in Year 2 placement and on average between €19,000 and €24,000 in the Year 4 trainee management placement/internship. The student will need this money to live; i.e. accommodation, food, social activity, travel etc. A student who is thrifty may be able to save to make a contribution to his or her tuition fees. Students are permitted to work for up to 20 hours per week during college term and up to 40 hours per week during college holidays. The minimum wage in Ireland is €8.65 per hour.

FEE INSTALMENTS

In Year 1, tuition fee (€13,500), accommodation charge (€3,300), meal charge (€400) and health insurance (€120) amount to €17,320. This overall charge of €17,320 can be paid in two instalments. Similarly, tuition fee in Years 3 and 4 can be paid in two instalments. See table below for dates payments are due:

A discount of €250 only applies for Year 1, if the full Year 1 fee is paid in advance, in one instalment. In this case a fee of €17,070 is payable on acceptance of a place in Year 1. Fees are non-refundable except in cases where projected academic results are not achieved or where a visa is not granted.

ADDITIONAL YEAR 1 EXPENSES

FEE INCREASES

Fees for years 3 & 4 as shown above are not increased except by the national inflation rate, currently approx 4.3% per year (August, 2008)
